CAMP RULES

- Reservations: request must be received and approved at the Council Service Center by Wednesday prior to the scheduled reservation. Campsite reservations are on a first-come basis.
- Check in/Check Out: Upon arrival park in the parking lot and call the Camp Ranger or staff listed to check in. They are present for your safety and to support the success of your outing. Check out is handled in the same manner.
- Adult Leadership: The Boy Scouts of America policy requires a minimum of two adult leaders on all camping trips and tours. The leader in charge must be at least 21 years of age. Both two leaders MUST be "Youth Protection Trained." Submit copy of training completion.
- Automobiles: Abide by the 10-mph reservation speed limit. Vehicles may be taken to the campsites for loading and unloading ONLY. At other times, they should be left in the main parking lot. When you arrive, please unload your gear at your campsite, park your car at the parking lot, then walk down and set up your camp. Similarly, when you leave, have everything packed and ready to go before bringing your vehicle to the campsite. Do not drive inside the campsite.
- Conduct: Leave your campsite in an improved condition. Do your part in helping maintain camping areas in a litter free and natural state. No alcoholic beverages permitted in camp. Other rules: Posted on each campsite. Please review with Scouts.

Unit, Group and Family Camping Operating Guidelines – Camp Karankawa & Camp Huisache**Keeping You Healthy**

The health and safety of our Scouting families is our number one priority. We know our Scouts are eager to go outdoors and put their Scouting skills and knowledge to use. The South Texas Council COVID 19 Ad Hoc Committee has developed the following guidelines to allow Scouting Units and families to use our camp properties with limited access. We are working to keep your group healthy on your next visit to Camp Karankawa or Camp Huisache. We will update these guidelines as the situation develops. Please talk to the camp ranger or staff if you have any safety concerns while you are staying at our camps.

Important Please note - The following precautions are important, but they do not remove the potential for exposure to COVID-19 or any other illness while at camp. Some people with COVID-19 show no signs or symptoms of illness, but can still spread the virus, and people may be contagious before their symptoms occur.

Camps are limited in the total number of people allowed at one time.

Total number of families or groups per camp property per night:

- Camp Karankawa 6 groups (two groups per comfort station)
- Camp Huisache two (2) groups.

You must make a reservation before you arrive. Reservations can be made by submitting the Unit or Family Camping Reservation Form to Samula.jackson@scouting.org. For questions or more information contacts the Council Service Center at (361) 814-4300 ext.112. Please do not call the camp staff to make a reservation.

Restroom and Shower use at Camp Karankawa - Groups will be assigned a specific restroom and shower to limit COVID 19 exposure opportunities. Restrooms and showers will be cleaned prior to arrival, but groups must clean restroom and shower before departing. Staff will clean facilities prior to the next reservation.

Restroom and Shower use at Camp Huisache – with only one outdoor restroom and shower facility groups should monitor use of the facility to avoid or minimize contact or interaction with others outside of their family or unit group.

All camp headquarters, visitor centers, dining hall, and training center areas are closed for unit and family camping.

No organized programs will be held during unit camping including sporting sports activities, aquatic activities, training, or COPE at this time without appropriate certificated council staff. The swimming pool at Camp Karankawa is open for use with group size restrictions.

Safety Protocols at all properties

Please help everyone stay healthy by following these guidelines while at camp:

- Wash your hands frequently.
- Maintain at least a six-foot distance from anyone not in your group.
- To the extent possible, Scouts should remain with their patrol/group and not mix with other groups.
- If an assembly is needed safe social distancing should be implemented.
- Make hand sanitizer, disinfecting wipes, soap and water, or similar disinfectant readily available to members of your group.
- Disinfect shared group equipment after each use.
- One person per tent if not of the same family or household.
- If you or any member of your family or group are sick or if you or any member of your family or group has been exposed to COVID 19 within the past 10 days do not come to camp.
- If you or any member of your group exhibit any symptom of COVID-19 while at camp isolate the individual and contact the parent or guardian immediately. Contact all other parents to inform them of the situation. The unit should leave camp as soon as reasonably possible. Contact the camp ranger to notify him of the potential expose at camp.
