It's Recharter Time!

This year's recharter process remains unchanged from last year

The unit key 3 (Charter Representative, Committee Chair or Unit leader or designee) has access to the recharter via the <u>internet advancement site</u>. The same username and password for my.scouting can be used. Instructions and how to videos are available <u>here</u>.



If you need additional help contact your unit or district commissioner. You can also call your District executive or Sam Jackson, the council registrar, at the council service center. The

deadline is December 31St....Complete the recharter before then and don't miss out on the fun!

REMINDER: South Texas Council (STC) now requires all registered adults to maintain Youth Protection Training (YPT) compliance for their entire registration period. This is a local council policy. As it is currently possible for YPT to expire during that period, the STC new policy may require retaking YPT training even though a registered adult's current YPT completion certificate may not expire for several weeks or months but will expire before the next recharter registration. <u>Click[here]to learn more</u>.

November Safety Moment

Food Allergies

According to Food Allergy Research & Education (FARE), one in every 13 children has a food allergy. Every 3 minutes, a food-allergy reaction sends someone to the emergency room. And while the responsibility for management of a food allergy lies with the individual or the individual's parent or guardian, all of us need to be ready to assist in preventing — or helping in response to — a reaction.



A food-allergy reaction happens when the immune system overreacts to a food protein. A reaction can range from mild to severe. In the U.S., the most common food allergens are milk, eggs, peanuts, tree nuts, soy, wheat, fish, shellfish and sesame seeds. However, any food might cause an allergic response, and many people are allergic to more than one food. Also, initial food-allergy reactions can occur at any time.

A food allergy should not be confused with a food intolerance. An intolerance is when someone cannot digest a component of a food, such as lactose, a sugar found in milk. An intolerance may cause abdominal cramping or diarrhea but is not life-threatening.

WHAT TO DO IF SOMEONE HAS A FOOD ALLERGY

If someone has a food allergy, they must be diligent about avoiding allergens. They must always read all food labels before eating or drinking any food. Even tiny amounts of an allergen can cause an allergic response.

When preparing food, prepare food for people with allergies on a separate, clean surface to ensure there is no cross contamination. Start with clean hands and use separate and clean utensils and cooking tools, such as toasters.

For some people, bringing their own foods can be easier and safer when eating with a group. If you or someone in your unit has food allergies, be sure to review the <u>Food</u> <u>Allergy Guidance</u> before planning any event that includes food.

National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT)

June 23-29, 2024 Camp Karankawa

National Youth Leadership Training is an exciting, action-packed program designed for councils to provide youth members with leadership skills and experience they can use in their home units and in other situations demanding leadership of self and others.

The NYLT course centers around the concepts of what a leader must BE, what they must KNOW, and what they must DO. The key elements are then taught with a clear focus on HOW TO. The skills come alive during the week as the patrol goes on a Quest for the Meaning of Leadership.

NYLT is a six-day course. Content is delivered in a troop and patrol outdoor setting with an emphasis on immediate application of learning in a fun environment. Interconnecting concepts and work processes are introduced early, built upon, and assisted by the use of memory aids, which allow participants to understand and employ the leadership skills much faster.

In order to attend a NYLT course, a youth must have the following qualifications by the beginning of the course:

- Must be a registered member of a Scouting unit.
- Must have a current BSA Health and Medical Record form parts A, B, and C.
- As of March 1, 2019, Scouts BSA members (male and female) must be at least 13. They
 must have completed Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops. Scouts are required to
 earn the First Class rank before attending NYLT.
- Venturers and Sea Scouts (male and female) must be at least 14, or 13, have completed the eighth grade, and fall within the maximum age allowance for their program. They must have completed Introduction to Leadership Skills for Crews or Ships. It is recommended that they have had at least one year of camping experience. While NYLT is not an outdoor skills course, it is important that each participant have basic camping and outdoor cooking experience.
- Have a unit leader recommendation.


