Our Commitment to Youth Safety

The South Texas Council (STC) Boy Scouts of America (BSA) firmly believes that being an adult leader in the BSA is a privilege, not a right. Every BSA adult leader must undergo an extensive, multilayered selection process to ensure they will uphold the BSA's proud commitment to youth safety. All STC adult volunteers must be registered with the BSA and trained in youth protection to ensure that all adults know how to recognize and correctly report behaviors suspicious for grooming and abuse. Additionally, registered volunteers are required to complete Youth Protection Training (YPT) annually and adhere to all BSA safety policies and procedures.



EXPLANATION FOR THE REVISED POLICY: On April 20, 2023, the STC Executive Board adopted a YPT policy to reinforce our awareness of youth safety. STC now requires all registered adults to maintain YPT compliance for their entire registration period. As it is currently possible for YPT to expire during that period, the Board's new policy may require retaking YPT training even though a registered adult's current YPT Completion Certificate may not expire for several weeks or months but will expire before the next recharter registration. Although YPT is valid for two years, the STC requires all volunteer leaders to have a valid YPT Certificate for their entire registration period/year. In other words, the expiration date of each leader's training must be later than the expiration date of their registration. The STC will suspend volunteers' BSA membership, and they will be unable to participate in Scouting activities if their YPT certification is expired or will not be current for the entire registration period/year. My Scouting sends reminders 90, 60, and 30 days before YPT expiration; however, the STC policy may require individual leaders and units to monitor YPT and registration expiration dates to maintain compliance.

The BSA has also adopted <u>Barriers to Abuse</u> policies for the safety and well-being of its members. These policies primarily protect youth members; however, they also serve to protect adult leaders. Registered leaders must follow these guidelines with Scouting youth outside of Scouting activities.

Finally, as a reminder and opportunity to update your training immediately if your YPT expires before the next recharter of your unit or your adult registration expires, use the following instructions:

How to Complete Online Youth Protection Training

First-time users: Visit the *My*.Scouting <u>website</u> and create an account. From the *My*.Scouting portal, Youth Protection Training is available through the BSA Learn Center. The course has three learning modules and a certification test. You must complete all four parts. Upon completion, print the training certificate. Training certificates must accompany all adult applications.

Returning users: Log in to the *My*. Scouting <u>website</u>. Click on "Menu," then "My Dashboard." On the Youth Protection Training listing, choose "Retake Course." Complete the training and print out the completion certificate. Records sync with the national and council databases within 24-48 hours of completion.


The donations will go to help local food banks, pantries and agencies in their efforts to feed the hungry.

Annular Eclipse - October 14

On October 14th, there will be an Annular Solar Eclipse, and Karankawa will be directly in its path!

Timeline of Events as seen from Camp Karankawa:

10:25 am - Partial Eclipse begins

11:54 am - Full Eclipse begins

11:57 am - Maximum Eclipse

11:59 am - Full Eclipse ends

1:36 pm - Partial Eclipse ends



Never look directly at the sun, even during an eclipse! The sun's rays can burn your retinas and permanently damage your eyes. Always wear special eclipse glasses that are made to block all harmful rays -- regular sun glasses won't work!



Eclipse Activity #1

Did you know there are beads that change color in the sun? These UV-reactive beads can be found online and in craft stores for around the same price as the non-reactive kind.

Use string to make bracelets, or lace beads on pipe cleaners to make unique creations. Let scouts experiment with the beads, observing the effects of UV radiation. What happens if you coat them in sunscreen or drop them in ice water?

Eclipse Activity #2

Solar paper (also known as Cyanotype paper) is a special paper coated in a light sensitive solution. When exposed to the sun, the compound reacts with the ultraviolet rays to create a deep blue pigment.

Have scouts arrange flower or leaf pieces to make unique designs on the paper. Place in the sun for about five minutes, or until the paper turns bright blue. Rinse thoroughly with water to remove any remaining solution and set the image. Place paper in the sun to dry.



Discuss how the sun's radiation can have an effect on objects even though they can't physically see the rays!
