November is Youth Protection Month!

The South Texas Council (STC) Scouting America firmly believes that being an adult leader in Scouting is a privilege, not a right. Every adult leader must undergo an extensive, multilayered selection process to ensure they will uphold Scouting America's proud commitment to youth safety.

Scouting 🐋

All STC adult volunteers must be registered with the BSA and trained in youth protection to ensure that all adults know how to recognize and correctly report behaviors suspicious for grooming and abuse. Any adult who goes camping with a Troop, Crew, Ship, or Post must be registered and be current on their Youth Protection Training(YPT).

Although the current Scouting America Youth Protection Training is valid for two years, the STC requires all volunteer leaders to have a valid YPT Certificate for their entire registration period/year. In other words, it must be taken annually and the STC has adopted November as our Youth Protection Training renewal month. How to Complete Online Youth Protection Training



America

First-time users: Visit the My.Scouting website and create an account. From the My.Scouting portal, Youth Protection Training is available through the BSA Learn Center. The course has three learning modules and a certification test. You must complete all four parts. Upon completion, print the training certificate. Training certificates must accompany all adult applications.

Returning users: Log in to the My.Scouting website. Click on "Menu," then "My Dashboard." On the Youth Protection Training listing, choose "Retake Course." Complete the training and print out the completion certificate. Records sync with the national and council databases within 24-48 hours of completion.

September Safety Moment - Campout Safety Checklist

SUMMARY

Camping is a long-honored tradition for many families, including the BSA family. Timing, supplies, and location should be determined ahead of time so you can make the most of your camping experience. There might be some instances where you overthink or underestimate a camping trip, but there are also many ways to enjoy the adventure, fun, discovery, and teamwork involved. A campout safety checklist will help to ensure these aspects of camping are accomplished while keeping you safe.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Camping can be enjoyable in almost any area—from the backcountry to summer camp, as well as national highadventure bases, to name a few. When you decide on a camping trip, you need to consider who, what, where, when, how, and why.

Here are a few items to check off on your Campout Safety Checklist:

- Documentation Needed—This includes medical records, guidebooks, and permission slips. A Scout leader can ensure your safety as well as his or her own when you are both better informed of any limitations, hazards, or permissions.
- Training—General training, such as Youth Protection training, CPR/first aid, and Hazardous Weather, or specific training, such as Trek Safely or Wilderness First Aid, gives you the confidence to know what to do in the event of an emergency.
- Planning—Planning is important. Become familiar with your campsite location and do some research about the weather, licensing/permit requirements, and project or activity guidelines so you can be prepared.
- Equipment—Plan for vehicles involved or tools necessary for your camping experience. Also consider trailer requirements and first-aid or emergency kits.
- Emergency Planning—A prepared Scout is a confident Scout. Keep a cellphone handy as well as a list of local authorities (fire department, police, hospitals, etc.) in case an emergency occurs, such as inclement weather or a lost Scout. If you are in the backcountry, canyons, or a remote location, coverage may be one to two hours away. A GPS tracking/messaging device is helpful in these locations.
- · Program-Know your program. There should be age-appropriate activities, safety equipment, proper supervision, and a discussion on potential hazards.

Personal equality. The uniform represents a democratic idea of equality, bringing people of different racial, economic, religious, national, ethnic, political, and geographic backgrounds together in the Scouting tradition

Identification. The uniform identifies youth and adult members of the Scouting America, visible as a force for good in the community. When properly and smartly worn, the uniform can build good unit spirit. When worn on the correct occasions, it can attract new members.

Achievement. The uniform shows the wearer's activity, responsibility, and achievement. What each youth or adult member has accomplished with program opportunities can be recognized by the insignia worn on the uniform

Personal commitment. The uniform is a constant reminder to all Cub Scouts, Scouts, Venturers, Sea Scouts. and adults of their commitment to the ideals and purpose of Scouting America. The uniform is a way of making visible members' commitment to a belief in God, loyalty to country, and helping others at all times.

While wearing the uniform is not mandatory, it is highly encouraged. The leaders of Scouting- both volunteer and professional-promote the wearing of the correct complete uniform on all suitable occasions.


